Comment:	George Frideric Handel (1685–1759) was a German-born Brit Baroque composer, famous for his operas, oratorios, anthems and organ concertos. Handel was born in 1685, in a family indifferent to music. He received critical musical training in Ha Hamburg and Italy before settling in London (1712) and becoming a naturalized British subject in 1727. By then he wa strongly influenced by the great composers of the Italian Baroque and the middle-Ge (more online)
